What we do at Deyes Careers:

Thanks to our supporters here at Dyees we are running a variety of Careers Events across the academic year.

Here at Deyes High we have a variety of activities you could get involved in. Below are some of the activities which we run regularly:

Careers Insight Breakfasts: All year around. Companies, Professionals or Industry representatives allow interested pupils from across all years insight into their company, their industry or share their career story. Pupils volunteer to attend and this creates a very relaxed atmosphere. Pupils volunteer for a variety of reasons and these sessions are especially popular with our pupils in Year 7-9. We can also hold these specifically targeting 6^{th} form students. Sessions are running during our registration period 8:45-9:15. We do not have set dates for these. Dates can be negotiated to suit your business.

Assembly talks: Formal 10-minute presentation on industry, business or profession. Great way to engage a full year group and open their eyes to possibilities and opportunities they had not considered before. Dates can be negotiated throughout the year.

Business Networking Breakfasts: Dates attached in flyer. Opportunity for local businesses to network over a brew and a butty. During the second half pupils join us to network with professionals practicing their communication and professional skills, whilst finding out about opportunities in their local area. This is a great opportunity if you enjoy influencing and sharing your own story with pupils. It is almost like being able to talk to your 15-year-old self. 8:30am – 9:20am.

Mock Interviews: every year in February and June we mock interview all of our Year 13s(Feb) and Year 10s (June). No experience of interviewing is necessary. We provide all questions and feedback sheets. This is a fantastic opportunity for anyone who wants to make a real impact on individual pupils. You are based with a variety of other professionals and have the opportunity to network yourself. Dates for this year: Year 13: 5th Feb 1pm-4pm; Year 10: 18th June 9am-3pm or part of this.

Careers Convention: Every year held on last Friday of September. Traditional Careers Fair which is attended by around 30 businesses, all local universities and many colleges. Compulsory to all Year 11s and open to Year 9 and 6th form students. The fair gives you opportunity to engage with over 300 pupils in a short amount of time promoting your business, marketing your products and inspiring our students to explore careers in a save and supportive environment.

Input during Collapsed timetable days: Companies volunteer a number of their employees to deliver employability or enterprise activities for our pupils. A real chance for your staff to development their skills set, whilst being supported by experienced teachers. Professional volunteers usually really enjoy the experience sharing their knowledge and skills with the next generation.

Company visits: Small groups of pupils visiting business premises to get a feel for a business or industry. These are either selected pupils connecting their subject to the world of work or open visits

for which interested students are invited regardless of subjects studies. Taking students away from their usual day to day school routine can have a profound impact on their opportunity awareness. Visits are extremely successful to challenge stereotypical thinking of our students.

Work experience: We are also always desperate for work experience placements for Year 11 and Year 12 pupils, especially for our cohort of young people without connections into their chosen industries. Dates: Year 11 first week in December each year. Year 12 beginning of July each year. Work experience is extremely powerful to support our students to achieve their potential as it allows them to demonstrate their skills sets in a professional environment. Our students are resourceful and creative and many businesses have relished in the chance of a fresh pair of eye looking at their processes. Some also know a variety of ICT shortcuts which have actually have helped businesses to improve their processes.
