Highlights:

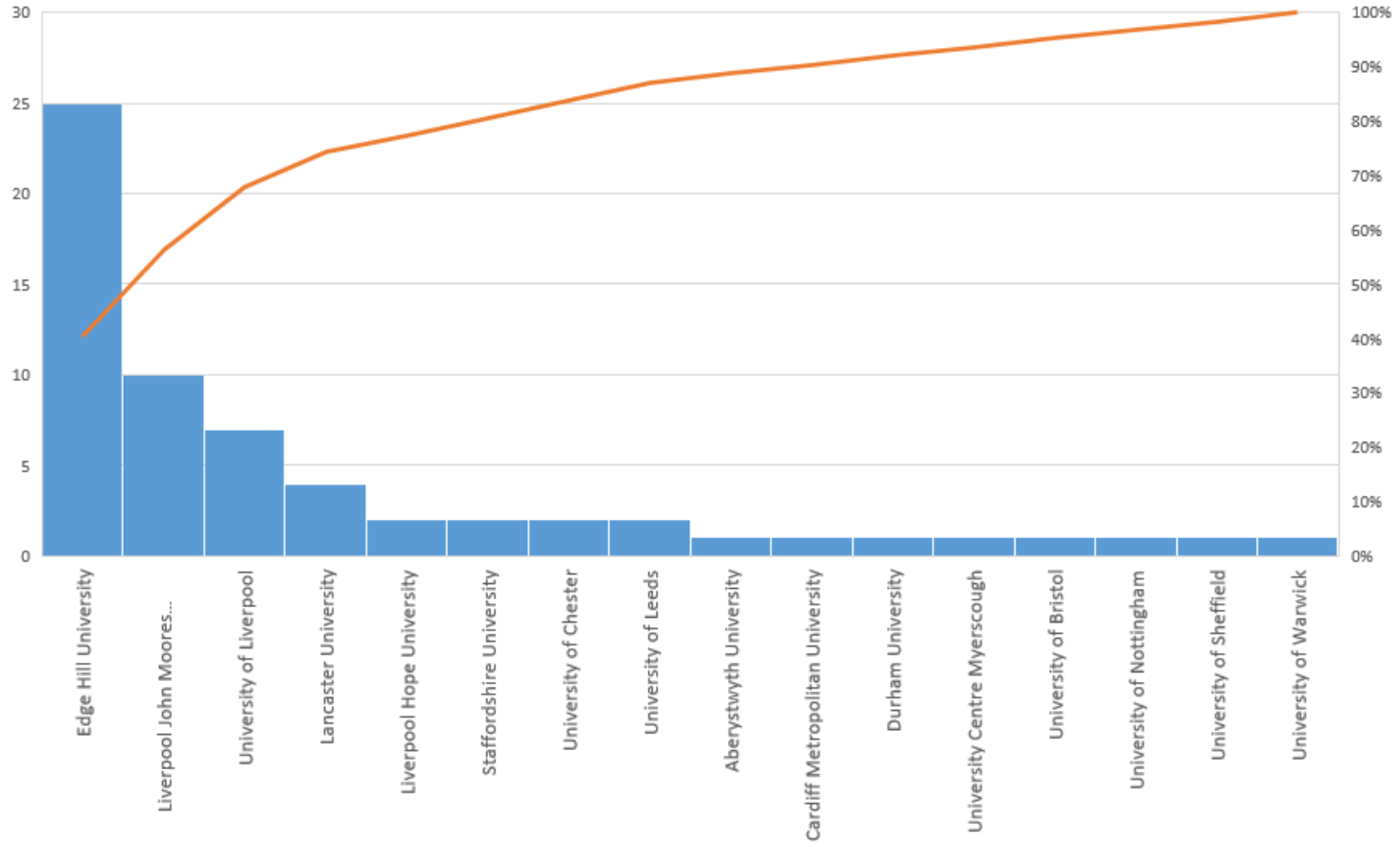
Overall 61% have progressed in to HE 39% are following work based routes.

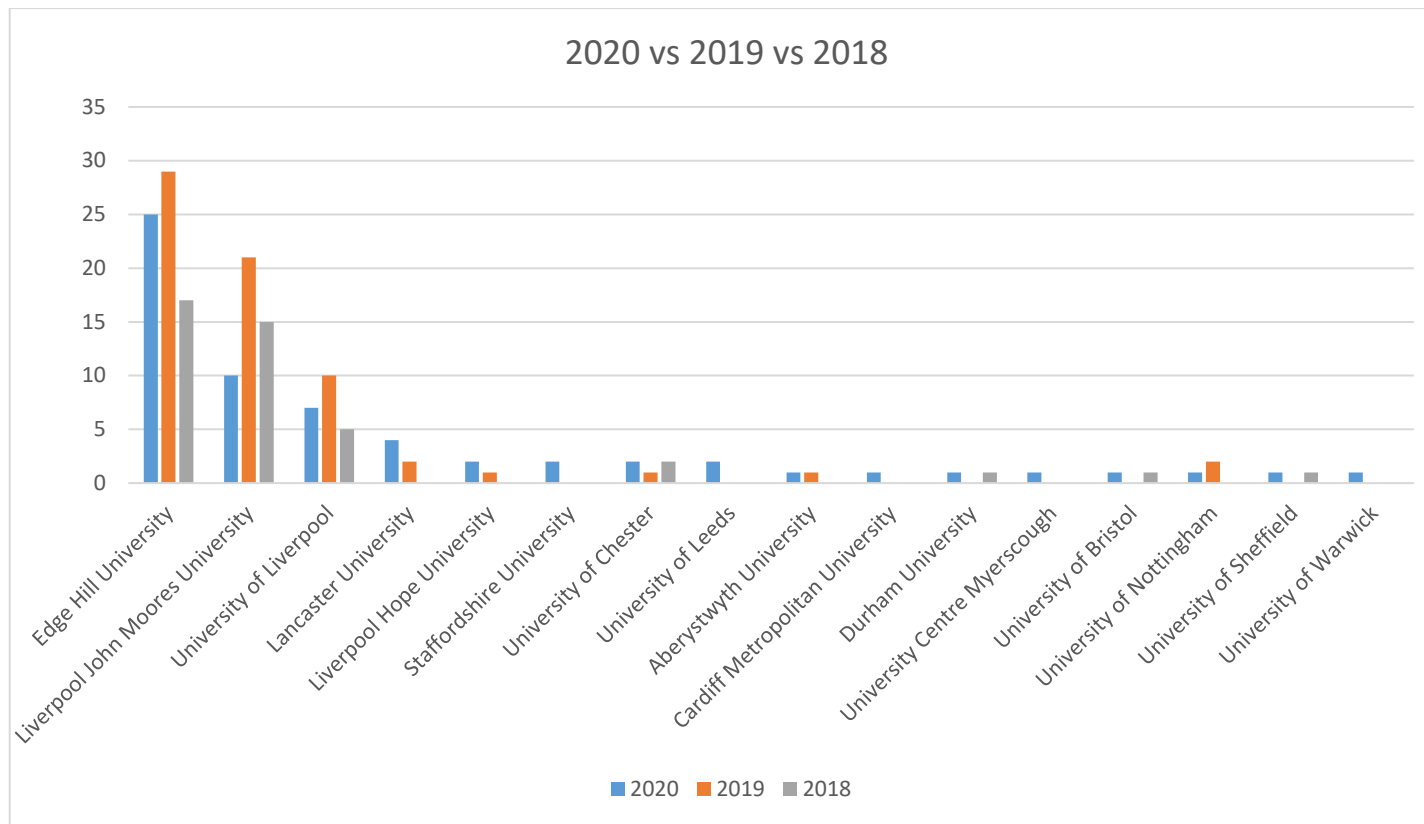
Degree apprenticeships are on the rise currently 2 students have secured highly competitive jobs, others have taken up roles with local and national companies in a variety of roles. We are in the process of confirming further destinations, and numbers will increase over the next weeks. JRL – Joe was chosen from over 1000 applications. George Harrison secured Higher Apprenticeship as Mental Health Nurse. Jamie McGuire started a Finance Apprenticeship with a local housing association for which recruitment was supported by Knowsley Council offering additional support to their LA residents. In response to government drive to encourage the uptake of apprenticeships amongst young people and our students keen to explore this option further we have integrated information, advice and guidance into our SMSC programme and offered full days of support as part of our Deep Learning Days.

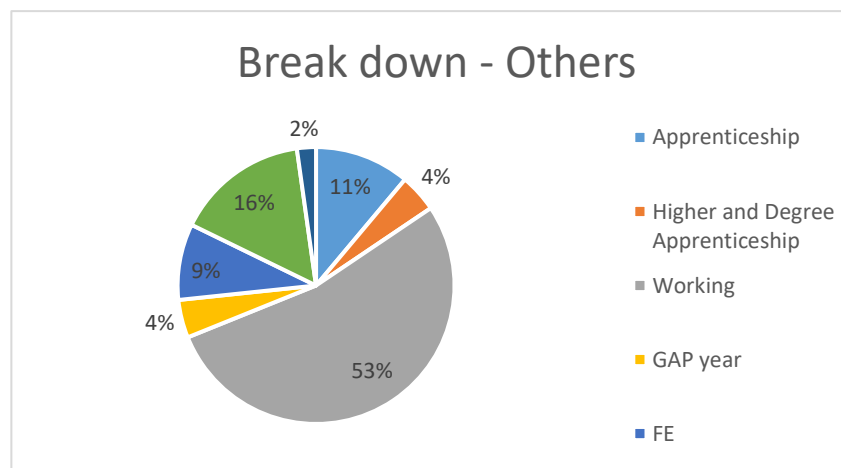
Progression into alternatives to HE:

The trend at Deye High continues that a significant number of 6th form leavers choose to progress into alternatives the Higher Education. We have responded to this trend by increasing our 6th form Enrichment programme to include dedicated Deep Learning Day around understanding alternative options as well as finding and applying for work opportunities. We have worked closely with the Careers Department and external agencies such as the Apprenticeship Hub and Employers to ensure our students have access to up to date and relevant information, advice and guidance in regard to their choices.

A note to NEET: The unemployment rate (the proportion of the economically active population who are unemployed) for 16-24 year olds was 13.4% in May-July 2020 in England. <https://commonslibrary.parliament.uk/research-briefings/sn05871/>

In August 2020 8.2% of 18-24 year olds claimed Job Seeker allowance in Liverpool. Many of our leavers are not claiming benefits due to their personal circumstances and find themselves financially supported by their family. Careers has made families aware of their entitlement during follow up phone calls and sign posted NEET leavers to support agencies and offered careers guidance and application support even after the official leaving date.

Whilst our NEET figure is higher than in previous years, Deyes High 6th form leavers have shown their adaptability and resilience securing full and part time position across a variety of industries. The market for entry level jobs is highly competitive at the moment due to traditional school leaver industries closed and many office jobs based at home making it difficult for employers to take on inexperienced staff.

Covid has also led to two students having to take a GAP year as they have been unable to start their secured opportunities. Josh holds an offer for a prestigious degree apprenticeship with EY and Jess was due to fly to the USA to start a football scholarship at Coastal Carolina University.

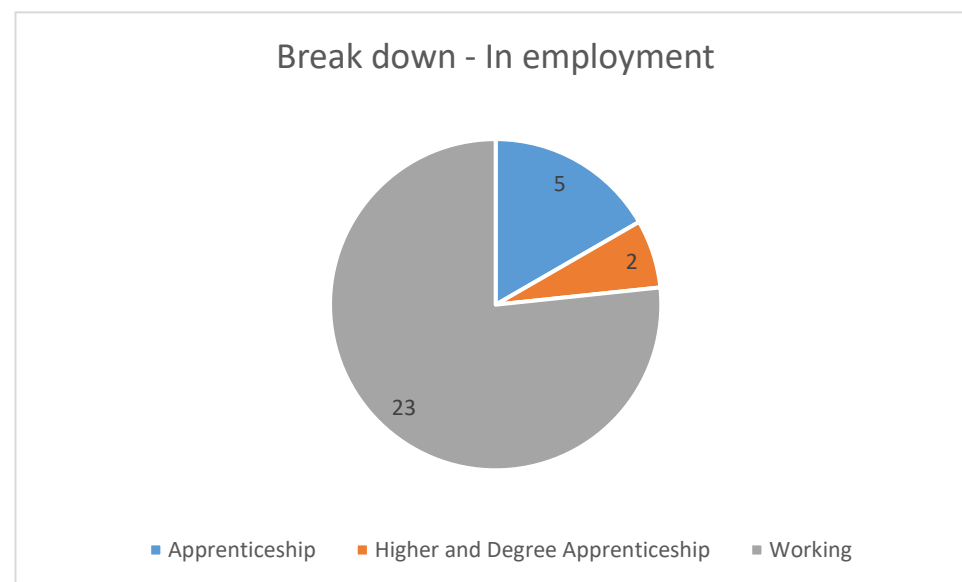
