Government and Politics is a new A-Level offered at Deyes and will be delivered by the History department. A level Politics develops your skills of analysis, interpretation, evaluation, and communication. You will learn to write precisely and to argue logically, assessing the strengths and weaknesses of political institutions, processes, concepts and ideologies.

Politics is a subject that compliments many other areas of study including History, Sociology, English, Philosophy, Geography and Psychology. It is a highly regarded and rigorous academic subject

Students can expect to have varied and engaging lessons. Students will take part in class debates, group work and independent study.

Students will also enjoy and annual trip to the House of Parliament in London, where they will meet their local MP and will watch a session in the House of Commons and House of Lords.
