Deves High School prides itself on being a school that nurtures the leadership potential of the future generation.

We strongly believe that genuine leadership opportunities help to build a stronger school community and empower students. These leadership roles deepen the sense of pride students feel about their school and enable them to develop leadership skills and contribute to school life.

Alongside the student leadership prospects, there are ample opportunities for students across the school for all students to have a voice. These include formalised opportunities for students to contribute their opinions and ideas with regards curriculum, social times, rewards, but to name a few. Feedback from these activities has resulted in changes to the school uniform and school environment, most recently the toilets.

Duke of Edinburgh Scheme

To successfully achieve any of the three awards – Bronze, Silver or Gold – you need to complete various activities. They involve helping the community/environment, becoming fitter, developing new skills, planning, training for and completing an expedition and (for the Gold Award only) working with a team on a residential activity.

Bronze Award training sessions take place during Wednesday lunch for pupils in Years 10 and 11, while an E-DofE drop-in session runs during Thursday lunch for any pupils in Years 9 – 13.



Kindness for Others

We encourage and actively support our pupils to lead community service initiatives and undertake appropriate voluntary placements, both during the school day and outside school hours. By doing this, important not only develop pupils communication and organisational skills. They also develop into compassionate and altruistic young people who will contribute to not only their local communities but also global society when they leave school. Pupils organise collections for local and national charities ranging from the Trussell Trust Food Bank to Comic Relief. Many also give up their time after school or over weekends to volunteer for local charities such as Clatterbridge, Alder Hey Children's Hospital and local primary schools.

Enrichment and Wellbeing

Research shows that participation in enrichment activities contributes to well-being. Enrichment activities have also been shown to be an important part of helping students to problem solve, empower them to express emotion, become adaptable to situations and contribute to the development of friendships. All of which are incredibly important.

It is also recognised that participating in enrichment activities have cognitive, social, and mental health benefits, and this is even more important during stressful times, for example exams or assessments, and particularly when social interactions have been limited due to lockdowns and COVID.
