# Personal Investigation (Element 1)

They will learn that all work produced should be student focused.

They will learn how to gather appropriate research from primary and other sources and contexts

Students will use skills developed throughout the KS4 art curriculum and Advanced level art journey to produce a personal response that shows a connection to the work of the artist/designers studied.

Assessment will be both formative and summative through the kS5 journey.

4. Present a personal and meaningful response that realises intentions and, where appropriate, makes connections between visual and other elements

Students will learn that practical investigations need to be sustained showing a development of skills.

They will learn how to demonstrate that work produced is of a greater depth and skill level of that produced in Year 12.

Students will produce a range of individual investigative, and experimental pieces with no restrictions on size, materials, or techniques.

All work will be carefully presented for final assessment alongside the written element.

### **Written Element:**

Students will begin to draft Chapters 1 and 2 of the Main essay content.

Students will be taught how to analyse in detail specific artworks from their chosen artist designer in relation to their personal theme. They will research specific information on the artists personal life so that they have a greater understanding of the meanings of Social/Cultural and Historical contexts.

departmental moderation are all used when assessing the outcomes produced.

Grading is submitted for external OCR quality assurance. A sample of assessed work will be externally moderated by a Visiting examiner.

By producing a portfolio of artwork this will allow students to display skills and knowledge that have been consolidated through the production of a series of work and a final outcome in response to their chosen theme.

The production of a 2000 word written response to the Personal Investigation will allow students to reflect on the development of skills and knowledge acquired throughout the course in relation to their CHOSEN theme.

The written response should be fluent and comprehensive using the advanced language and terminology of Art & Design, Photography, and Textiles. This will allow students to demonstrate a greater understanding of their Chosen theme.
