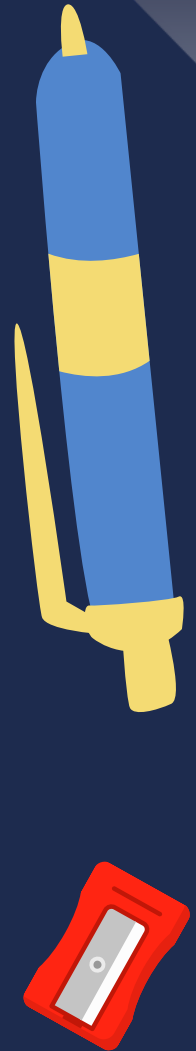

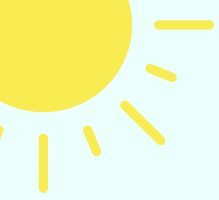

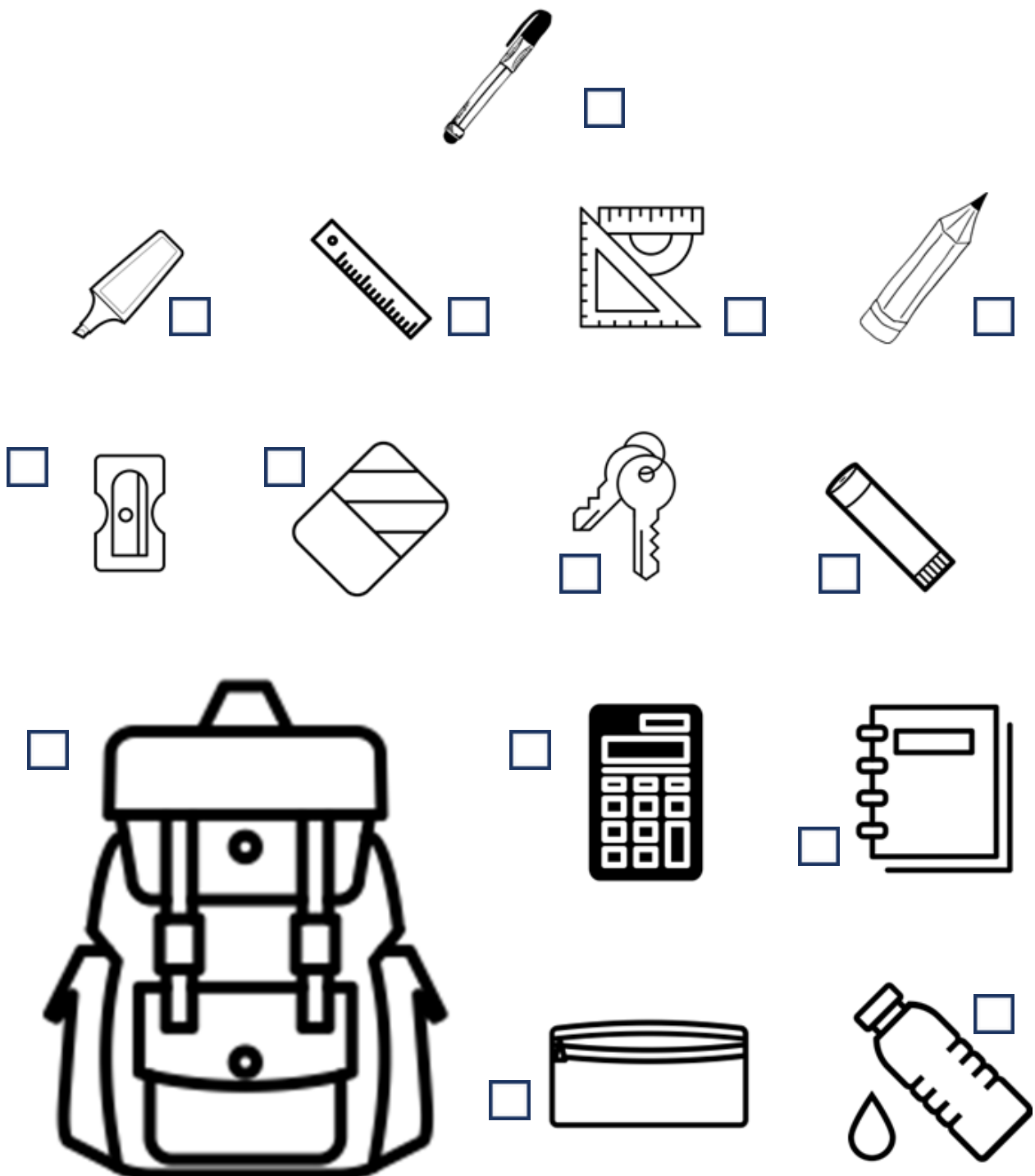

YOUR BEST DEYES

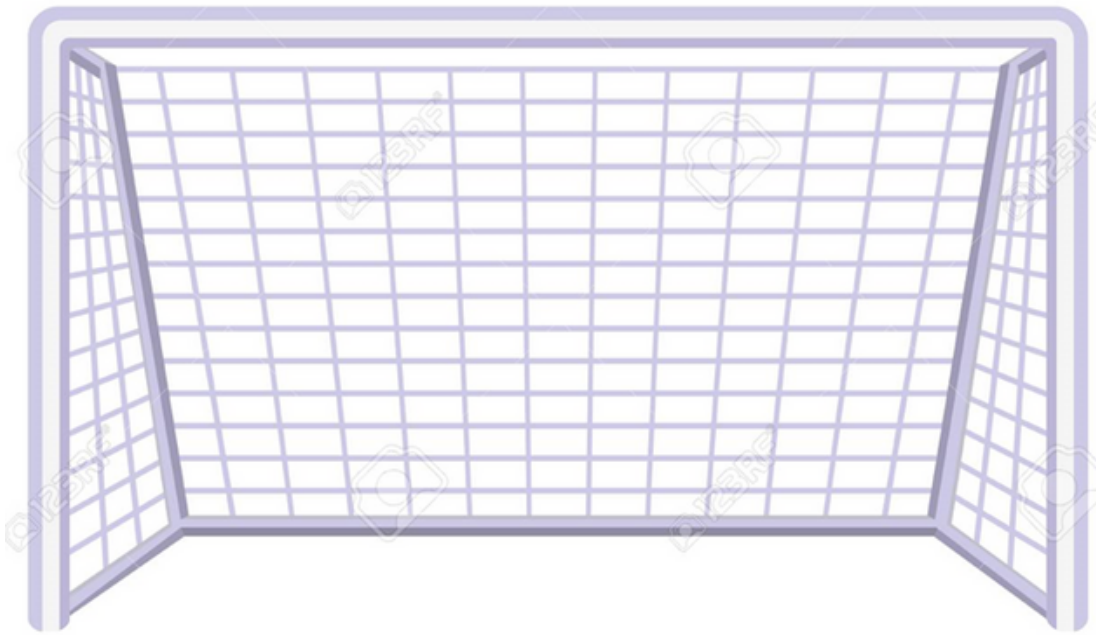
All students at Deyes have been invited to complete a series of challenges, working towards a badge that you can wear with pride. The challenges will engage you in all aspects of school life whilst also empowering you to try new activities and develop new skills. Below are the Year 7 challenges.

<p>Regularly attend an enrichment activity</p> <p>Students will have many opportunities to engage in enrichment activities both during the school day and after school. Regular attendance would be at least 4 times during a half term.</p>	<p>Read aloud during Project L on 3 or more occasions and engage in wider reading</p> <p>Students should read a range of books from different authors, fiction, non-fiction from a variety of genres, that must be book level appropriate.</p>
<p>Support others within the school</p> <p>Students will have many opportunities to fulfil this and should consistently support their peers in a range of ways, for example, Mentoring, Coaching, Induction, Options.</p>	<p>Attend a cultural or sports event outside of school</p> <p>Students must experience a range of enrichment activities in their own time such as music concerts, football matches, cadets or dancing that are not arranged by the school.</p>
<p>Represent the school in a sports, performing arts or subject specific event</p> <p>For Performing Arts events, such as Music events, Drama, Dance, students must contribute consistently towards these. This can be front of stage or backstage, in areas such as lighting and sound. In sports, students must represent the school consistently in sports events or team, such as, Football, Athletics, Netball etc. Other examples include Formula 1 in Schools, Debates, Science Fairs.</p>	<p>Achieve at least 'good' attendance</p> <p>Regular attendance at school is a vital part of academic success and as such your attendance is of great importance throughout your time at school.</p>
<p>Achieve full marks on the QI Challenge</p> <p>Students should aim to achieve full marks on the QI challenge at least once during a half term.</p>	<p>Take part in/contribute to a charity event</p> <p>Students must get involved in fundraising events to support local or national charities. These events could be with their tutor group, whole school or open to the local community. For example, Children in Need, or Comic Relief.</p>
<p>Contribute to the school environment</p> <p>Students can actively participate in improving and sustaining the school environment, litter picks, helping in the canteen, recycling projects etc.</p>	<p>Contribute to a whole school event</p> <p>Students can volunteer at several whole school events, be a tour guide at open evening, sign parents in, represent a subject area, help with refreshments.</p>
