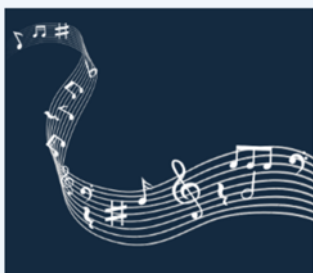

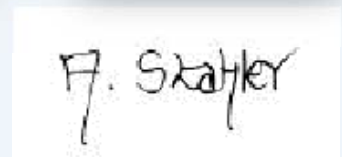


Senior Citizens’ Party

At 3.00am on Monday 17 October 2018 police were called to 10 John Moores Street, Liverpool after the neighbour reported a disturbance and saw a male suspect running from the property, down John Moores Street and turning right into James Parsons Way. A young carer is ...

A young person between the ages of 5 - 17 who helps look after someone in their family because they are disabled, unwell, suffer mental health issues or misuse drugs or alcohol.

The person needing help would not be able to manage each day with out the support of someone else.

Most young people help out at home but young carers can have more serious responsibilities, such as helping a parent take medication or supporting them emotionally.
