Here is a timetable for our performing arts clubs, why not give it a try!



Enola Holmes

Have you watched the new film Enola Holmes that everyone is talking about? If so, you may have noticed some links between the movie and the original Sherlock Holmes books and to Victorian England. In this article I will explore the links between Enola Holmes and Sherlock Holmes.



First of all, at the start of the movie, we can see flyers for equal rights for men and women, this was a problem in Victorian England because men were seen as superior to women and they have been throughout history. We can also see the contrast between classes, like when Enola first goes to the factory and we see lots of lower-class women doing hard labour.

We can see quite early on in the movie that Sherlock appears to be drunk. This can relate to his substance abuse in the start of the novel by Arthur Conan Doyle 'The Sign of Four'. When Enola takes Sherlock home, we see she finds the latest case he is working on including blackmail of government officials. This case is the main plot in one of Arthur Conan Doyle's short stories 'The adventure of Charles Augusts Milverton'. The streets of London at night can appear dark and eerie like the atmosphere created in the sign of four book, showing us what London was really like in the early 1900s.

The movie ends with all of the women and young girls walking out the factory after Emily chapman delivers an empowering speech. This shows us links to the suffragettes and the suffragists who stood up for women and fought for rights in the early 1900s.
